LOGLINE (38 words):

LOVE EXILED chronicles the stories of four same-sex couples who immigrated to Canada where their relationships are fully recognized. Their dreams of returning home are still in the distant future. Until then, they live their love in exile.

SYNOPSIS (78 words):

On November 4th, 2008, three states - California, Florida and Arizona - voted to amend their constitutions, denying and revoking the rights of same-sex couples to marry. With Canadian allies, gay American families rally at a Vancouver demonstration to protest these amendments that persecute the LGBTQ community. Four families share their stories of how they met, their decision to escape to freedom in Canada, their Canadian experience and their dreams of returning to their home country, family and friends.

SYNOPSIS (123 words):

On November 4th, 2008, three states - California, Florida and Arizona - voted to amend their constitutions, denying and revoking the rights of same-sex couples to marry. On May 26, 2009, with Canadian allies, gay American families rally at a Vancouver demonstration to protest these amendments that persecute the LGBTQ community. Demonstration organizer Roger Chin relays the California Supreme Court's infamous decision on Prop 8. Subsequent speakers talk about couples living in exile. Weaving elements of public protest and intimate interviews, four families share their stories of how they met, their decision to escape to freedom in Canada, their Canadian experience and their dreams of returning to their home country, family and friends. In the end, the organizer celebrates the freedom to marry that exists in Canada.

Roger Chin, after hearing about California's Proposition 8 that banned gay marriage, organized the 2008 and 2009 protest rallies in Vancouver. This led to the documentary short film, **LOVE EXILED**, his first film to premiere at a film festival. He is a teacher who ventured into filmmaking during his education degree, producing, directing and editing an educational film. After sailing across the Pacific Ocean, he presented his travelogue film to several audiences including a show at the Vancouver Maritime Museum.

The gay community is at ground zero of the modern day civil rights struggle; Proposition 8 is today's Stonewall and a declaration of war from the far right. Melancholy and contempt were strong motivators when I began this project. Little did I know that, by the end of the day, we would be celebrating freedom.

PRODUCER'S STATEMENT:

In November 2008, I organized the Vancouver contingent of the worldwide protests in response to California's Proposition 8. I didn't know that I would meet so many "love exiles". Their search for freedom encouraged me to produce **LOVE EXILED**.

PROPOSITION 8

This initiative measure is submitted to the people in accordance with the provisions of Article II, Section 8, of the California Constitution.

This initiative measure expressly amends the California Constitution by adding a section thereto; therefore, new provisions proposed to be added are printed in *italic type* to indicate that they are new.

SECTION 1. Title

This measure shall be known and may be cited as the "California Marriage Protection Act."

SECTION 2. Section 7.5 is added to Article I of the California Constitution,

to read:

Sec. 7.5. Only marriage between a man and a woman is valid or recognized in California.
